Abuse can be one, all or a combination of the following:

- Physical abuse
- Sexual abuse
- Psychological/ Emotional abuse
- Financial/ Material
 abuse
- Nealect
- Discriminatory abuse
- Institutional abuse

It can be deliberate abuse or the result of ignorance, lack of training, knowledge or understanding.

Unfortunately, abuse takes place every day, especially in these types of unprecedented times.

If you believe a child, young person or adult is at immediate risk then please call 999.

Abuse can take many forms and can happen anywhere -

at home, in a residential or nursing home, a hospital, in the workplace, at a day centre or educational establishment, in supported housing or in the street.

It is the responsibility of each and every one of us to care for our community and report any abuse of a child, young person or an adult we have seen or may suspect.
