Tips for engaging ASD learners online **KS2/Secondary**



<u>Supporting independence</u>

- 1. Set out a clear timetable of the lesson/week
- 2. Offer a pre-teach session or work/resources to be sent out for the learner to look through before the lesson starts
- 3. Send the learner a list of questions you may ask during the session allowing them to prepare their answers ahead of the lesson
- 4. Don't insist the camera is on
- 5. Ensure all instructions or information is backed up with a visual representation
- 6. Enable 'chat' mode some learners may feel more confident
- 7. writing their ideas rather than speaking them
- 8. Set up a clear system for responses does the learner know when they can/can't speak or ask a question
- Reassure the learner they can have regular breaks, even during the session if necessary
- 10. Ensure the learner knows all this will be put in place ahead of the meeting in order to support any anxiety they may have joining a 'live' session
- 11. If possible debrief with the learners after the session on what they found helpful/what could be different next time







Liaise with parents

- 1. Ensure the learners space is clear of distractions and only has what they need
- 2. Ensure a timetable of the day is clear and easy to find
- Ensure the learner has regular breaks, even during a session. Speak to the teacher regarding what they feel is necessary/acceptable for learning breaks
- 4. Check the learner knows which lesson they are starting and any prep they have done before hand
